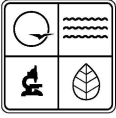

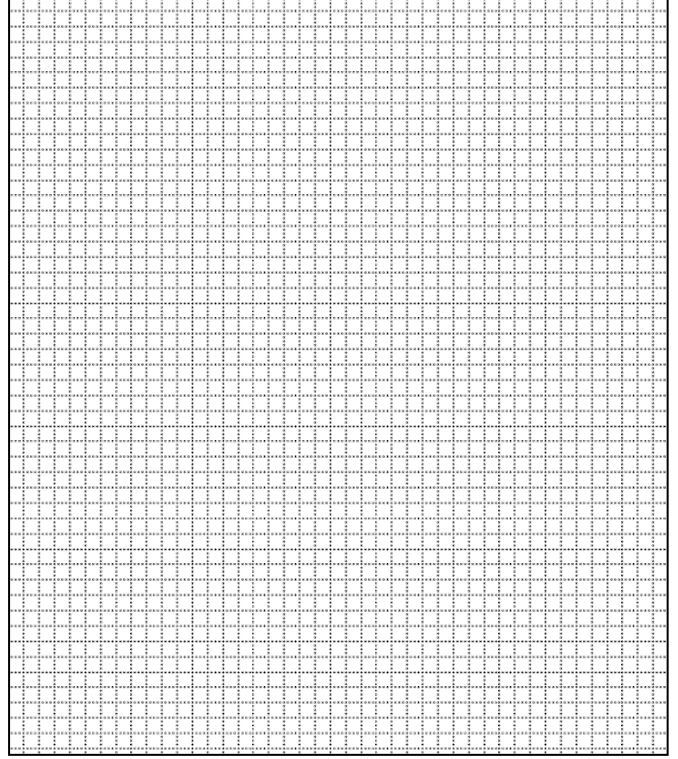
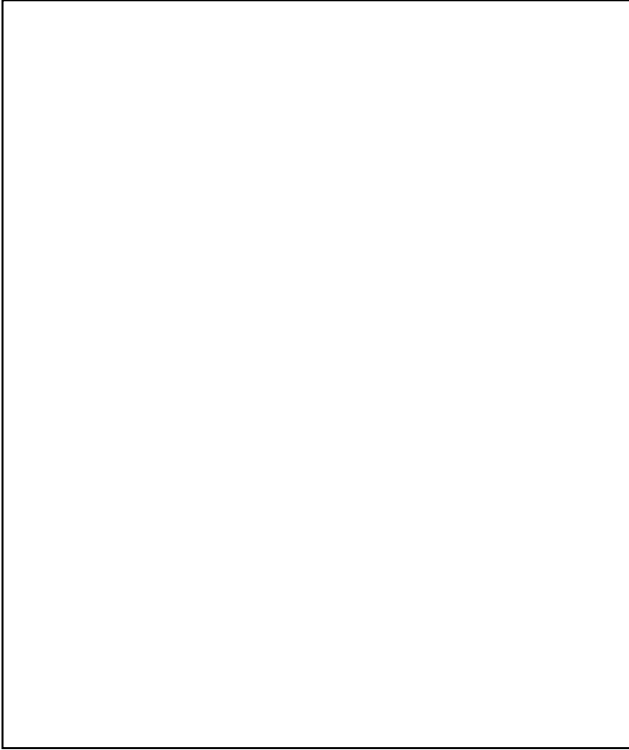

The house is now inside the main KCOM Museum Building.

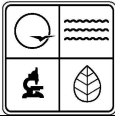

The structure is a single pen log house. It is entered by a single leaf door on the west and lighted by two windows. Both windows are on the south side, unglazed. The north gable end of the house is dominated by a very large fireplace chimney. Although this is situated outside the main plan, the roof extends to surround it.

The interior of the structure is very roughly finished. It is dominated by the large fireplace. A very small and steep stairs ascends to a small sleeping loft.

The structure was built c. 1828 near Jonesville, Lee County, Virginia. It was built by Abram and Martha Still, parents to Andrew Taylor Still who founded A.T. Still University in 1892. This house, Andrew's birthplace, was dismantled and brought to Kirksville in 1926 in anticipation of the 100th anniversary of Dr. Still's birth. The structure is important mainly in that it is the earliest example of the preservation movement in Kirksville. It also reflects a national trend during the 1920's, a trend which culminated in the Williamsburg project.
