ACTION PRESENTATIONS

Kirk-Tran Agreement

Councilmember Chrisman moved to authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Kirk-Tran for public transportation services; seconded by Councilmember Fajkus.

The Kirk Tran Board reviewed and signed the agreement which spells out the relationship between Kirk Tran and the City to clearly outline expectations.

Mutual Aid Agreement with County Sheriff's Department

Councilmember Chrisman moved to approve an intergovernmental agreement for mutual aid with the County of Adair, authorizing City Police Officers to receive Adair County enforcement commissions from the Adair County Sheriff's Department; seconded by Councilmember Edge.

The City has issued commissions to the Truman State University security that provides for them to assist the City Police Department when needed. This agreement allows police officers to receive commissions from the County, and the officers can assist deputies when needed. A lake patrol officer only has the authority on the water, but not off the water. This agreement will give the patrol officer the authority off the water.

Bid - Radio Equipment
