BILL NO. 2013-09 RESOLUTION NO. R3-4-666 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKSVILLE, MISSOURI EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO SENATE BILL 13 AND SUPPORT FOR THE MISSOURI SOLID WASTE DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kirksville, Missouri recognizes the value of recycling in the city and in other rural cities across Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, the recycling program in the City of Kirksville began in 1997 with a grant from the Northeast Missouri Solid Waste District; and,

WHEREAS, eliminating Missouri Solid Waste Districts would reduce opportunities for recycling in rural Missouri by putting grant funds out of reach for many smaller cities; and,

WHEREAS, private solid waste haulers have no obligation to offer recycling services under current Missouri laws.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Kirksville, Missouri that the governing body hereby expresses its opposition to Senate Bill 13.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor of Kirksville, Missouri, hereby expresses the support of the Kirksville City Council for Missouri Solid Waste Districts as organized under existing State statutes.

Second Reading of Ordinances

BILL NO. 2013-11 ORDINANCE NO. 12044 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 OF THE KIRKSVILLE CITY CODE BY CREATING THE FRIENDS OF THE FOREST-LLEWELLYN CEMETERY COMMITTEE. WHEREAS, Kirksville's Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery represents the social, political, cultural and military history of our great City. Monuments serve as both the repository of the past and the inspiration for the future. Cemeteries give us the ability to move forward while remembering those who have made our way possible. They also offer endless opportunity for historical, artistic, architectural and genealogical pursuits.

WHEREAS, there is great need for funding to help restore and preserve the Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery. The ravages of time, weather and, unfortunately, occasional vandalism topples monuments, collapses tombs and wreaks havoc on the cemetery. Repairs are very expensive and little maintenance to this part of the cemetery has taken place due to limited funds, and there is no shortage to the number of repairs that are needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Kirksville, Missouri, that Chapter 7 of the City Code be amended with the following addition:

Section 1. Cemetery Committee.

The Friends of Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery is founded to assist in the restoration and preservation of Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery. As a member of this organization, members are expected to prioritize renovations, establish long-range maintenance plans to repair broken monuments, damaged statuary, and collapsed tombs; replace dead trees; and renovate the entryway into the Cemetery.

The Friends of Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery will work with Kirksville City staff and other community organizations to ensure that the Cemetery is preserved for the education and appreciation of future generations.

The Friends of Forest Llewellyn Cemetery will develop and disseminate educational information to the general public generating both an awareness and appreciation for the historical significance of this local landmark.

The Friends of Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery will identify and establish fund raising events and activities that will be outlined in an annual calendar of events.

<u>Section 2</u>. Committee Membership.

The membership appointment to the Friends of the Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery will be made by the Mayor with consent of the City Council. No membership terms will be established.

Staff support will be provided by the City Manager, City Clerk and Public Works Director.

<u>Section 3</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage.

<u>Section 4</u>. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be included and incorporated in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kirksville, Missouri, as an addition or amendment thereto, and shall be appropriately renumbered to conform to the uniform numbering system of the Code.

ORDINANCE NO. 12045

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKSVILLE, MISSOURI REZONING REAL ESTATE LOCATED AT 1009 E. PIERCE STREET HEREIN FROM R-2 TWO FAMILY RESIDENTIAL ZONING TO CP-1 PLANNED LOCAL BUSINESS ZONING, AND CHANGING THE ZONING MAP ACCORDINGLY.

WHEREAS, the owner of the property Caleb Sturm has submitted an application for rezoning of a tract of land located at 1009 E. Pierce Street; and

WHEREAS, the real estate to be rezoned is hereinafter legally described as:

Lot 7, Block 8, Fible's Addition to Kirksville; and

WHEREAS, the request for rezoning of the aforesaid lot was placed in a daily newspaper of general circulation 15 days in advance of a Public Hearing, and property owners within 185 feet of the property to be rezoned were notified by certified mail; and

That the above described real estate be, and the same is hereby rezoned from, R-2 Two Family Residential Zoning to CP-1 Planned Local Business Zoning and the Zoning District Map as set forth under Article I of Section 25-6 of the Zoning Ordinances of said Code shall be changed accordingly.

This ordinance shall be of full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.
